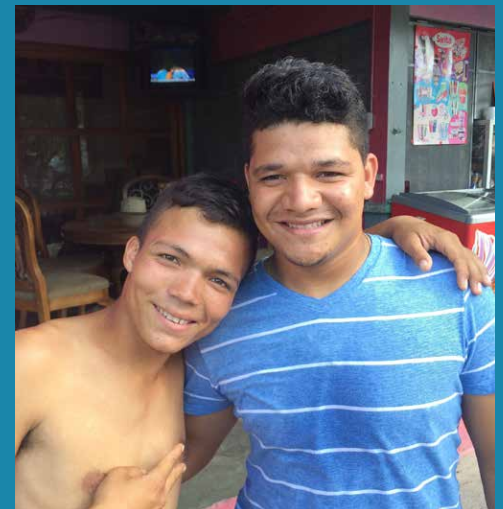
# A Visit from FPC
